In March, Ann and Merlin will be presenting ideas to the Board about both enhancing the area in front of the clubhouse fountain and about possible

locations for the community garden. The clothesline area will no longer be considered as a possible site of the community garden.

A discussion regarding soil improvement – use mushroom mulch, and grind up your organic kitchen scraps – eggshells, coffee grounds, vegetable scraps, banana peelings, water, etc. - in a blender and dump the mixture in your garden. The worms will love it!! The importance of "layering" compost materials. Google it to find out how to layer and what to add to your soil to make it more productive.

A question to consider – should the club offer to be involved in harvesting fruit (oranges, lemons, or grapefruit) from trees in the complex that are full of fruit and are not being picked?? The harvest could be shared with the homeowner, others in the park, and with local food banks. Approval would be needed from the office as well as from the homeowners. More information on this later.
