Security Upgrades



INTERVIEW WITH PEW WISE ELDER - RUDY VALLE


Hello Rudy, thank you for meeting with me. When and where were you born?

I was born in Los Angeles on January 9, 1934.

Where did you grow up? In San Pedro at the Los Angeles Harbor, south of L.A.

Do you have siblings? Yes, there are 5 children: 3 girls and 2 boys. I am the second born.

Where did you go to school? I went to a Catholic school until they kicked me out in the 4th grade. What happened? I was fighting a lot. I was bullied and I fought back, so I was sent to public school. I graduated from San Pedro High School in 1951.



What did you do after high school? I was drafted into the Army; the Korean War was going on. After boot camp I went to Jump School and in 1953 I became a Paratrooper. By the way, 55 thousand American men died in Korea. Historians did not write about this.

Where did you go after training? I went to Fort Benning, Georgia for Paratrooper training, then to Ft. Bragg, North Carolina.

Did you go overseas? No, I was fortunate to be assigned as a Chaplain's Assistant. I worked with the Catholic, Mormon, and Southern Baptist Chaplains; I stayed at Fort Bragg. I had become very close to the Catholic priest, Father Brady; he became my mentor. My pay was not very good, so I told Father Brady I wanted to go to a Rifle Company, because I wanted to be promoted to make more money. As I was walking out the door of his office, he called to me, "I know you don't pray. You better start praying, because if they send me to Korea, I'm gonna find you!" Well, neither of us was sent to Korea.

That was lucky. For sure, I spent the rest of my duty at Ft. Bragg in a Rifle Platoon. I made Staff Sergeant before my enlistment was up. **When did you leave the Army?** I was discharged in 1956.

What did you do when you got home? I began applying and studying to become an L.A. Firefighter. There were 72 openings for 3200 applicants; I came out in the top 1% in the exam; I was in the first class.

You had a good career as a Firefighter. Yes, for 14 years, from 1956 until 1970; then tragedy struck. I was badly injured when a burning roof came down on our team, and my back was broken. I remember that as I was going into surgery, the American astronauts had just blasted off for the moon. Then, as I was being wheeled into my home, Neil Armstrong set foot on the moon; this was August 1969.

Are you married? Yes, I married for the first time in 1954, while I was in the Military. We were married for two years, then divorced. It was amicable; we had no children. We both agreed that the marriage would never work; it was a mutual decision and the best we ever made. Now I have been happily married to Claudine for 63 years. How did you meet her? We met at a wedding reception of mutual friends; both my brother and I were there with dates, but we managed to buy Claudine and her friend a drink and make a date for the future; but we didn't

really date until 2 years later. **Why not?** Not sure. I guess at that time we weren't that much attracted to each other.

But obviously you met again later and were attracted. Yes. We were asked to be members of the wedding party of friends we both knew. Finally, we were attracted to each other and began to date seriously.

When were you married? We married in 1959 at the Wayfarer's Chapel in Palos Verdes, a beautiful setting.

Where were you working? I was a Firefighter with LAFD, and Claudine was a Dental Assistant.

Any children? Yes, we have a boy and a girl. Our son Phillip is a Professor of Theater at Cal Poly San Louis Obispo; he has written many plays. In fact, one of his plays was honored at the Kennedy Center. What was the title? I forgot! Our daughter Lisa is a bi-lingual teacher in Washington, on the Olympic Peninsula. She went to the University of Guatemala and is fluent in Spanish. Any grandchildren? Yes, One young man, Zayde, age 18; he visits us often.

Let's get back to your career. After you were disabled from your firefighting career, what happened? I had to retire, of course, but they gave me a good pension. Then I decided to go to college. Where did you go? I started at Harbor College, and then transferred to San Diego State; I majored in History because I wanted to teach. However, I took a course in Sociology, then Psychology, and I was hooked. My idea of teaching evolved into becoming a Psychologist or Counselor. I subsequently earned a master's degree in Psychology.

Where did you work? For 15 years I was the Head Counselor at San Marcos High School; I loved every minute of it. I couldn't wait to go to work!

When did you retire? In 1989. What have you been doing? I've been practicing purging my guilt complex. What do you mean? I've been enjoying life and having fun!

Tell me more. We enjoy travelling and socializing with friends and family. **To where have you travelled?** We spent 3 months in Europe; went to Spain, Italy, Croatia, Portugal, and others. **Where was your favorite place?** I loved Ireland. **Why?** The people were amazing; they have the greatest sense of humor.

When did you move to PEW? In 2017. From where? Lakeshore Gardens in Carlsbad. Before that we had a beautiful home in Vista.
