Garden tips from the panel discussion – panel members included Merlin, Marilyn, Robin, and Ann

Fertilizing this time of year – use granules heavy in Nitrogen rather than liquid. The rain will wash the liquid away quickly, but the granules will dissolve slowly. Best Pak granules are available from Miramar Wholesale Nursery and probably other places as well.

March – fertilize citrus trees. Jobe spikes and lime are possibilities.

Always amend your soil from year to year to keep it fresh. Free mushroom mulch from Mountain Meadows Mushroom Farm and free mulch from San Pasqual Valley Soils are excellent options

Irrigation – drip is always preferable to overhead.
