MILLENNIUM MEMO AUGUST 2021

Today's burning topic: house fires.

We had two of them a couple months ago: one in Northern California and another in our Orange County community. No lives were lost (but a couple of pets were), so we were grateful for that. One home was insured, the other wasn't.

There are so many lessons here, some of which we've discussed before. One that should be obvious: make sure your home is insured! Mobile Home Insurance isn't that expensive, at least compared with a stick-built home. Just confirm that you have full Replacement Cost coverage.

I'd also guess many of you are under-insured, given the cost of a new manufactured home today. A new home could easily cost as much as \$150K straight from the factory, not including delivery and set-up—and even more if you buy one from a dealer.

Then there's the cost to dispose of the damaged home. In many cases, the burnt shell is considered "toxic waste," which is costly to remove. Does your policy cover that?

A couple years ago, 560 folks in our 3 San Marcos Parks got free Smoke Detectors, courtesy of SPARC, our unfortunately named resident services partner. Our NorCal resident credits his detector with saving his life, so make sure yours is working.

Lastly, keep in mind that Palomar's streets are Fire Lanes. We'd hate to lose a resident because the Firemen were delayed getting to the scene by an improperly parked car.

Speaking of Fire Safety...remember this bit of trivia from a couple years ago?

- Q. Where does a Fireman go to meet a new flame?
- A. Match.com, of course.


Just a reminder to get your pool ID bracelet from the office if you do not have one or if you can't find yours from last year.



PROFILES OF OUR WISE ELDER NEIGHBORS OF PEW

NANCY SIMS

Interview 4 in the series: Meeting the Seniors, age 90+ living in our Park.

Interview with

Commander, Bob O'Malley, USN [Ret.]

Greetings, Bob, thank you for meeting with me. When and where were you born? In Troy, New York, February 17, 1926.



Did you grow up there? Yes, but as soon as I graduated high school in 1943, I joined the Navy. I was an enlisted man for 14 years, then was promoted to a Commissioned Officer for 10 years; in total, I spent 24 years in the Navy. **WOW! I bet you saw a lot of the world.** Oh, yes indeed. Not enough space here to tell you about it, but I was in World War II, Korean War, and Vietnam.

Tell us a bit about growing up. Well, my mother died when I was 10, in 1936. Fortunately, my Aunt Kit lived nearby, and helped take care of my brother Charles and me. **This was during the height of the Depression. Were you affected?** Certainly. My dad lost his job in the shirt factory, but then worked for the WPA, thanks to FDR. You know the saying, "We were poor, but didn't know it"? Well, my family always said, "We were poor and damn well knew

it!" The WPA job helped us survive.

You were married? Oh, yes, for 63 wonderful years. **How did you meet your wife?** I met Theresa (Teddi) at the Great Lakes, Illinois Naval Station. She was a civilian working there, and I was on fire watch in the Electronic Supply Office from midnight until 8:00 am. My buddy and I

enjoyed the last few minutes of our watch looking at the young ladies coming to work. I spied Teddi, and I said, "See that girl? I'm gonna marry her". It took me 3 months to get a date with her, but finally we went to dinner; we had several dates and then we fell in love. I never actually proposed to her, but it was understood between us that we would marry. Well, 5 months later, I went on sea duty and didn't see her for a year. But we wrote constantly. I was in China serving on the USS Hamner DD718; I bought the silk for her wedding dress, which her sister made. We planned to marry when I returned in 1950, but then the Korean War broke out. I deployed on the same ship, the USS Hamner. After a year, I returned to Illinois to fetch my bride. We were married in 1951; then we moved to San Diego, but soon moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota. We lived in a lovely house on Lake Minnetonka; I was Chief Petty Officer then.

Do you have children? Yes, we have four. Our first son, Roger, was born in Minneapolis in 1952. He now lives in San Clemente and has 2 kids. Next, Pamela was born in Naples, Italy in 1955. She lives in Parker, CO. The twins, Mark and Matt came along in 1962 in Detroit, MI. Mark lives in Carlsbad, has 2 kids, and Matt lives in San Diego and also has 2 kids. I have 8 grandchildren. **Super. Do you have great-grandkids?** Sure, I have 9 thus far.

So, you were in the Navy for 24 years, from 1943 until 1967. What did you do after you retired? I became a Branch Mgr./V.P. at Santa Clarita National Bank, Newhall, CA, north of L.A. I worked from 1968 to 1985. In 1985, we moved from the San Fernando Valley to Pine Mountain Club, a recreation-oriented community [golf, tennis, stables] inside the Los Padres National Forest, south of Bakersfield.

What about Teddi? Until the kids were grown, she was a homemaker and a wonderful mother. She then went into real estate at Pine Mtn. Club, as an agent from 1992 to 2001. In 1986, I formed R. H. O'Malley & Associates, a mortgage brokerage firm at Pine Mtn. Club. In 2001, we moved to Warner Springs to be closer to our children and grandchildren.

When did you come to Palomar Estates West? In 2007 to be closer to our children and grandchildren. We love it here, made many friends and participated in PEW activities. Then my dear Teddi got ill; she was struck with Alzheimer's in 2008. I took care of her as long as I could, then she went to a board and care facility for 2 years. Teddi went home to Our Lord the day after our 63rd wedding anniversary, on May 6, 2007. **So sorry.** Thank you.

So, Bob, do you have any hobbies? Not really anymore. I used to like building model airplanes and ships.

What do you do now for relaxation? I love to read; I especially enjoy reading history. **What are you reading now?** I'm reading <u>Lincoln and Grant</u>. Very good. I also like to listen to soft, easy listening, light classical and country western music as I read, or just listen and relax.

Do you see your sons often? Oh yes. Mark comes at least once a week, and we have pizza and beer. I see Matt and Roger at least once a month. Pam [Colorado] comes for an annual visit.

Do you like to go out to eat? Sure, I go often with the boys. **What is your favorite restaurant?** I like the Chinese Panda Garden nearby on the corner; I also love a good filet mignon at the CA. Mining Co.

Do you like to cook? Yes, I make bacon, eggs and toast for myself most mornings. I get Schwan's frozen food delivered to me for dinner, and I enjoy that very much.

What is the secret to your longevity? The Good Lord has smiled upon me. Yes, but isn't it said that "The Lord helps those who help themselves"? It is. I have been blessed with good health my whole life. I exercise every morning by stretching and using my leg exercising machine.

Have you ever had surgery? Appendectomy 1939. **Did you get the COVID vaccine?** Yes, of course! In February.

I have no special diet; I eat everything I want; I have ice cream every night, and a wee dram of Irish Whiskey occasionally.

Any words of wisdom for us? On the back of my business card is a quote from Admiral Mahan from the early 1900's: "He who would be captain of his ship, must first be master of his soul". Also, I want to say, "Live each day to the fullest".

I often say, "Your, call, Lord, not mine". I'll be with my Teddi again when I am called home.


