**Community Garden** – The basic outline/structure of the garden is complete. Some plots have been spoken for. Mushroom mulch is in almost all of the plots. Each plot "owner" is responsible for filling the plot with additional potting soil and peat moss.

If you have **spare garden tools, consider donating them for use at the community garden.** There is an **annual fee of \$20 for each garden plot.** 

Other possible "needs" for the community garden – benches, a tool shed, a berry bush, miniature fruit trees, and so on. Your suggestions are also welcome.

We ordered 10 yards of **mushroom mulch** and found that there is quite a bit leftover. If you need some good mulch, help yourself!

Also, we will be using **good cardboard as a weed suppressor.** So, if you have large, **flat cardboard pieces** that you won't be using, please take them to the community garden area for use there.
