# MILLENNIUM MEMO NOVEMBER 2021

Last October, I reported that there had been 22 home sales during the 12 months ending Aug. 15, 2020, at an average sale price of \$296,750, an astounding number.

How about 2021? For the 12 months through Aug 15, 2021, Palomar West had 27 sales, at a lower-but-still-astounding average price of \$276,400. Yes, the average price is lower, but the values were more consistent, with fewer very low or very high prices. Given that, the \$276K number is probably an accurate indicator for most homes.

To put those 27 sales in context, here are the turnovers for the previous 6 years: 22, 46, 36, 28, 30 & 30. That's as far back as I have data readily at hand. Sale volume rebounded a bit, but we're not back to the pre-COVID sales levels.

These numbers tell us two things: (1) lots of people are waiting for the chance to become your neighbors and enjoy the Palomar lifestyle, and (2) your home is worth a <u>lot</u> of money! Do you feel a little richer now?


CONCRETE REPAIRS ---- Friday 10/22 (per diagram)
ASPHALT REPAIRS ----- Monday 10/25 (per diagram)
ASPHALT MILLING ----- Monday 11/15 (per diagram)
ASPHALT OVERLAY ----- Tuesday 11/16 (per diagram)

#### PLEASE OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS:

- 1. On concrete day and while concrete is curing, access will be limited around concrete areas. Do not drive over concrete until after asphalt repair work has been completed.
- 2. On asphalt repair day access will be limited around asphalt repairs, we will do are best to minimize any inconvenience.
- 3. While milling edge of streets, cars will be able to come and go as they please, only parking in their carport is permitted ALL ROADWAYS AND PARKING AREAS MUST BE CLEAR (per diagram)
- 4. On asphalt day, residents who reside on street being paved and plan on using their vehicle. Please move your car out by 7:00 A.M. and then you may return after 6:00 P.M. ROADWAYS AND PARKING AREAS MUST BE CLEAR (per diagram)
- 5. Please have irrigation sprinklers shut off from one day before and one day after each move in. Hand watering O.K. with no overspray or runoff onto asphalt surface
- 6. Please have all overhanging bushes and vegetation (if any) trimmed and removed at edge of the Street, to allow access for paving equipment.
- 7. Advise the disposal company and mail service of dates.
- 8. Please tell residents to be careful turning while driving, as new asphalt will remain tender up to 6 months.

Hello Garden Club Members. Our club seems to be growing (no pun intended). Welcome to our new members!

Ann Kreile shares a bit about last Saturday: a group of our Garden Club members toured the Finch Frolic Gardens in Fallbrook. It was a wonderful experience to see how Diane Kennedy and her daughter have turned their property of 1 1/2 acres into a permaculture food forest. Diane talked about how to grow fruit, vegetables, native plants, herbs, bamboo, nuts, heirloom roses and ornamentals as we strolled under a canopy of sycamore and oak trees. Water catchment, planting tips, chemical free garden, sheet mulching and much more was taught in this gorgeous environment.



Merlin Chancellor talked to us about kitchen garden compost - fruits/veggies, coffee grounds, tea leaves, eggshells, small twigs, cardboard, and others. These help in increasing water retention and drainage of soil, keeps weeds down and adds nutrients to your garden. We also toured his garden at his house! Amazing talent he has!

Rob Green talked a bit about Monarch Butterflies. He will come back and do another presentation. They only live for about three weeks. Their primary purpose is to reproduce. They lay up to 300 eggs! If you want to create a Monarch habitat, plant milk weed and nectar flowers.

Our next tour will be at Weidner's Gardens in Encinitas. Date to be announced.
