#### **MILLENNIUM MEMO**

#### August 2022

A couple months ago, I gave a sneak preview of the draft Budget. With the Budget now final, these are some of the larger projects that made the list:

- Continue adding Water Isolation Valves--\$125K.
- Street Sealing—an endless project--\$75K.
- Remodel Spa Area & Deck--\$30K.
- Driveways--\$30K.
- Fencing along Viewpoint Drive--\$25K.
- Replace Golf Cart--\$14K.
- Repaint Space Numbers, Pool/Gazebo Furniture, Gym Equipment, Shades for Clubhouse Doors, Seal Edge of Pool--\$31K.
- Convert Final Pickleball Court--\$5K.

That's \$335K in Park Upgrades. Last year's Surplus was only \$263K, so it's fair to say that every dollar of your rents will be reinvested back into the Park—and then some. Your Rent Dollars at Work!

#### About That Break-In

You heard that burglars broke into the Office back in June. Three other Parks in San Marcos, including Palomar East, were also hit. Two people have been arrested, and Police have recovered much of what was stolen.

No computers were taken, and all resident files were safely locked away, although the thieves did take a number of previously-deposited rent checks and the Petty Cash box.

This is the first such incident in our 19 years of ownership, but we are reviewing our security procedures and speaking with the Police, so as to prevent this from happening again. Thank you for your understanding about this disturbing event.

#### A Good Start

As of July 6, 65% of you had returned your Income Certs, for which we thank you. The savings generated by your Certs will pay for many of the items on the list above.

By the time you're reading this, we'll be at 100%, won't we?

#### How Bad Is the Water Shortage?

According to one State water expert: "It's so dry, dogs are marking their territory with chalk lines." That's serious!

Keep conserving water, turn in your Income Certs...and enjoy your summer.

- We would like to remind all of you dog owners that Dog Park hours are 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.
- Water meters will be read on Monday, August 8th.
- Remember anyone that stays with you 20 consecutive days or 30 days in a calendar year must be registered with the Park Office and be over 35 years of age.
- Prior to listing for sale a mobilehome that is to remain in the Park, Homeowner shall inform Park Management of his/her intent to sell and shall furnish information regarding the selling agent.

### **Street Parking**

#### **#9 PARKING**

**B.** In Streets. No parking at any time is allowed in an area designated as a fire lane. All streets are considered fire lanes. Vehicles parked on the street may be towed away at vehicle owner's expense. Homeowner and guest vehicles may be ticketed by management as a warning, and may be towed away thereafter if the violation persists or reoccurs. Contractors/workers performing work on a Homeowner's home (i.e., construction, handyman, house cleaner, etc.) may park on the street temporarily but must be available quickly to remove vehicle should an emergency response vehicle come through. Management assumes no liability for service vehicles that get pushed out of the way or damaged by an emergency response vehicle. Anyone parking a vehicle on the street does so at their own risk.

**C. Guest Parking Areas**. Guest Parking spaces are reserved for guests' vehicles. A homeowner may not park in a guest parking area for extended periods without prior written approval of Park management. Homeowners may park in guest parking for temporary periods of time when visiting another homeowner or when their guest's vehicles are parked in homeowner's driveway. Whenever possible, Homeowner should notify management if they have reason to temporarily park in guest parking to avoid being towed. The parking spaces at the laundry facility may be utilized during laundry room use or as guest parking spaces.

Pool Passes are designated tor guests to use the pool when a homeowner is unavailable to accompany them. So, any visitors should be with a resident or carrying a pool pass. Any resident has the right to question someone they don't recognize.

#### WISE ELDERS OF PEW

#### INTERVIEW: PART 3 WITH GEORGE KRELL

#### MEMORIES OF PEW 25 YEARS AGO BY NANCY SIMS

Hello George let's talk about your reminiscences regarding living in Palomar Estates West. When did you and Connie move here? We bought our house here in 1997.

**How did you choose PEW?** We did research while still in Boston and found that this place in San Marcos was a lovely location; additionally, it was very close to the Palomar Airport.

**Why was that important?** Connie and I love to travel, and in those days the airport offered daily flights to Los Angeles, Phoenix and occasionally to Las Vegas, when the casinos offered special packages. The airport is only about 2 miles down the street. Also, we could fly to L.A. then get a connecting flight to New York or wherever for practically nothing. Often, we would fly to L.A. in the morning, spend the day touring, or going to the theater or the museums, have dinner, and then return home in the evening. It was wonderfully convenient and easier than driving. I'm very <u>disappointed</u> that they no longer offer commercial passenger flights.

Why, with the population growth here, did they limit, rather than increase the flights? I have no idea, but I sure miss that convenience, and low cost. I think we should form an association to look into that and petition the airport to add more commercial flights to large cities.

What was the Park like? The park was very different then; in those days you bought what they called a modular structure that could be easily moved. Our house had been in another park and was moved here. The cost was ridiculously low; it was registered like a vehicle with the DMV. Just like autos, the home values decreased rather than increased. Of course, now we have permanent structures, property values and taxes go up accordingly. The Park at that time was 80% occupied; if you had a dog, you HAD to live on the first two streets only, now called Sierra and Big Sky. We bought our house on that street because we could not part with our precious dog. We would have preferred a house further up on the hill, with a better view.

**Speaking of dogs, was there a dog park here?** Oh no; we weren't allowed to walk dogs on the street either. They could go in our back yard, but otherwise, we had to drive them out of the park to the empty spaces nearby. The

development to the west here was not there, so we went there and met several neighbors who brought their dogs there.

What was the neighborhood like? It was very rural, almost like wilderness. Across the street where the tree nursery was, there was a big coyote colony. Every 2 weeks at night we would hear them howling very loudly for about 30 minutes. I was very curious about that

phenomenon, so I went to the Animal Services Department and asked them about this. The Ranger explained that it was a mating ritual (aka orgy!). At least we found out what all the fuss was about. At that time, since there was very little development, the coyotes felt free to roam our streets; they even often came up to the houses. Because we had a small dog, we had a high fence built around our property to keep our dog safe from coyote attacks.

There was a racetrack nearby; many of the business parks are there now. We could hear the roar of the race cars every weekend. Considering this was "out in the country" it was quite noisy! San Marcos Boulevard almost to Carlsbad going west was primarily agricultural, with many tomato fields nearly to Carlsbad, no housing or business parks.

What did you do for fun activities? One of the best things about the neighborhood was Restaurant Row; it was much larger then, with many lovely restaurants. We would go to the movie, which is in the same place today, park there, and walk next door to the restaurants. It was very convenient, but now that opening is gone.

I was one of the two founders of the Shuffleboard Club. At that time, we had three professional shuffleboard courts; but they were torn down to build the structure where the gym is now located. We have a poor imitation of a court now, but I still enjoy playing.

I also helped to start the weekly low cost (nickel-dime) Poker games here. We meet at each other's house every Wednesday. It's still active after 25 years!

Every week we had a walking club. About twenty people from the park met at the Clubhouse and we would carpool to Carlsbad State Beach. We parked at the beach (free then) and walked along the beach to the Army Navy Academy in Carlsbad Village, then turn around and walk back through the village to a coffee shop for breakfast. The entire walking round trip was about 3.5 miles.

What other activities do you enjoy today? Of course, we love our dog Lambie and enjoy playing and walking with him; we still enjoy travelling; we have a cruise coming up soon. We have season tickets to the North Coast Reparatory Theater. We enjoy the theater and their excellent productions. Life is good at Palomar Estates West!

I want to reiterate very strongly that we are missing out on convenient and frequent passenger\_flights from our local airport. Our decision to move here was the nearby location of Palomar Airport, an important factor for us. Please bring back the airport for us!! <u>Let's form a group to petition the airport and the airlines.</u> Contact George if you are interested.
