Disturbances

We are all concerned about the peace, tranquility and safety of all the residents here at Palomar West but none of us are trained in handling domestic disturbances or prowlers. Home Occupancy

We would like to remind everyone that Park rules require homes to be owner occupied. This means that if you are away from your home on vacation, traveling for recreation or business, no one should be staying in your home.

Utility Cover

Park rules require that utilities be easily accessible and free of any storage either on top or around the enclosure. If it becomes necessary to remove the enclosure in order to make a necessary repair, any replacement of the enclosure or items on or around the enclosure will be at the home—owner's expense.

Please be careful and considerate of our crew when throwing anything sharp or harmful in with your trash. The crew has recently run across broken bags with glass, syringes and blood products. No one has been hurt yet, but we want to make sure there are no future accidents.

PROFILES OF OUR WISE ELDERS

This is #1 in a series of interviews with the Wise Seniors who are our neighbors in the Park.

Ann Kreile: Born September 16, 1928 in Huntington Park, CA, a suburb of Los Angeles.



Question: Where did you grow up? **Answer:** Same place, Huntington Park, a perfect place to grow up.

Q: Your parents? **A:** They both came from Sweden and married here in California in 1925.

Q: Any siblings? **A:** I have one older sister; she is 95 and lives in Willits, CA.

Q: Children? **A:** Yes, three: one son, two daughters. My oldest, Nancy, lives in Bonsall, Jim is in Morro Bay, and LeeAnne, the youngest, is in Phoenix.

Q: Do you have grandchildren? **A:** Yes! 3 boys, ages 28 -31.

Q: Any great-grandkids? **A:** Not yet.

Q: Where did you go to school? **A:** High school in my hometown, then 2 years of college at Pepperdine University, when it was on Vermont Ave. in L.A. It's now in Malibu.

Q: What interrupted your education? **A:** I got married to a wonderful man at age 21! We went to the same high school, but he was 2 years older. We didn't date in high school; we met through mutual friends.

Q: His occupation? **A:** When he came out of the Navy, he went to UCLA, became a teacher, then he became the youngest principal in L.A., working in East L.A.

Q: And your occupation? **A:** After two years of marriage, my husband Bill encouraged me to go back to college; I went to Long Beach State, and became an Elementary school teacher in East L.A. I was with the District for 27 years, teaching Gifted students, Art, and Science. Then I became a Master Teacher, helping to train new teachers. After that I worked in Personnel (Human Resources), hiring new teachers. I had a wonderful career.

Q: During that time, you managed to have three children? A: Yes

Q: Did you travel? **A:** Oh yes, since we were both educators, we had the summers off. We also took sabbaticals, where we could take a year off at half salary. We rented a van and took the kids all over the US. We also went to Europe, traveled all over, and met my parents' family in Sweden. After retirement, we sailed on the Queen Elizabeth II 26 times; we took 3 weeks a year and all together we sailed around the world twice.

Q: What are your hobbies? **A:** I've been painting with watercolors for many years. I used to sell my work at Art shows and Galleries in Los Angeles. You can see my work displayed in our Clubhouse, and on the cover of the 2021 PEW Directory. I also modeled a bit for magazines and newspapers, mostly ads. Additionally, I enjoy gardening; I dried the flowers I grew to create many projects. Great fun! For 25 years

in Fallbrook, I did plein air painting with a group. Plein air is painting nature and landscapes while being outdoors. We displayed our work at various sites in San Diego County. Once a year for 14 years we had a big show at the Myrtle Creek Nursery in Fallbrook where we sold our paintings.

Q: With such a busy life, I'll bet you found time for volunteering. **A:** My partner, Roger and I volunteer at the San Diego Food Bank once a week. It's a lot of fun and so rewarding!

Q: Please tell me about Roger. **A:** We met online about 2 years ago. We both lost our spouses in 2011, and we were both ready for another partnership. I'm so fortunate to have met another wonderful man! I know for sure that Bill would approve.

Q: OK, now we'll get a bit more personal info about you. Anything on your bucket list? **A:** No, not really. I think I've done it all. I still love traveling and intend to continue.

Q: What would your family say about you? **A:** That I'm loveable. At least they always tell me they love me. That I'm funny, sometimes in a weird way, HA!

Q: Please name three adjectives to describe yourself. A: Thoughtful, kind, and humorous.

Q: What is your idea of perfect happiness? **A:** Well, I feel that my life has been incredibly happy, all told. I remember a story from the philosopher Thich Nhat Hanh; when he met a small boy and told the boy he loved his big smile. The boy said, "Thank you" but Mr. Hanh said, "Oh no, I thank **you!** For making the world a better place, by your presence and your smile". That is what I aspire to, making the world a better place.

Q: Any words of wisdom for us? **A:** Keep positive thinking always.

Q: What is the secret to your longevity? **A:** I think my happiness is the key. I enjoyed a wonderful marriage for 62 years. I've always exercised; doing good for others makes me happy and energized. Meditation is great for stress relief; I've practiced for years. I crave healthy foods, so it's easy for me to eat lots of vegetables, fruits, and grains. I'm not a vegetarian; I eat meat and fish in moderation. We certainly can't discount good genes at the end of the day!

Thank you so much Ann, for your time and interesting information. I'm sure you have inspired others here at PEW. I have certainly enjoyed our conversation.
