MILLENNIUM MEMO MARCH 2021

A recent resident complaint has put us in a pickle—not something I relish.

The issue in question was whether, in this time of COVID (the all-purpose excuse!), Palomar's Pickle Ball Courts should be open to guests, or, like our other amenities, be restricted to residents only. There are good arguments on either side.

As I mentioned last month, our view is that matters involving resident activities are best determined in consultation with the residents themselves. Often that means PEWRA, the elected Board that represents Palomar residents.

With the Governor lifting his Stay-at-Home Order, at least as I'm typing this, PEWRA and Management agreed to allow guests back in the Pickle Ball area "with modifications," as the Governor likes to say. Restrooms remain restricted to residents only. All this is subject to change, of course, if conditions warrant.

The point of this discourse isn't whether guests are welcome or not. I just wanted you to know how we resolve disputes like this. Besides, I never want to tangle with a senior citizen with a paddle.

- First Kudo: to Eileen LaLone & her daughter Cora, who spent 3 full days cleaning out the Library and reorganizing the books. Great job!

DROP OFF YOUR TAXES!

Interfaith is offering a free tax drop off program where you will either bring a photo copy of your tax documents or we can make a copy in the office!

-You must bring all required tax documents* Please ask a manager if unsure

-You must fill out an intake form to put with your documents

-You may only drop off your documents on the designated days and times stated on this flyer

-Your documents will be safely delivered to the Interfaith office where they will notify you once your taxes are completed (1-2 weeks after drop off)

Adults 65 and over are now eligible for COVID-19 vaccine!



Residents age 65 and over are now eligible for COVID-19 vaccination and can receive vaccinations at County sites.

How to get an appointment for the vaccine for adults age 65+:

- 1. You are encouraged to first contact your doctor or healthcare provider to request the vaccine. Many healthcare providers are notifying their patients.
- 2. If a vaccine appointment is not available through your doctor, or you do not have a provider, then go to VaccinationSuperStationSD.com to make an appointment at a County or County Partner site. Appointments fill up very quickly and you may need to keep trying.
- 3. If you are age 75 and over, and you do not have access to the internet, you may dial 2-1-1 on your phone for assistance in making an appointment. Please do not call 2-1-1 if you are able to access the website.

Notes:

- Appointments are required; people without appointments will be turned away.
- Do not schedule an appointment if you have COVID-19, or are sick. Please follow Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) guidance for this situation:

- Wear a mask.

Here are some highlights from our February PEWRA Board Meeting:

Please read the flyer in the Hilltopper about Resident Dues for 2021. I think you will like our decision. If you have any questions, don't hesitate to reach out to any Board member.

As soon as it is safe to do so, we will move forward to elect new Board members. Until then, the current Board members have graciously agreed to remain in their positions.

We are researching costs associated with projects for our Wish List to Millennium for fiscal 2021/2022. So far, we have requests to convert the Pickleball courts from two courts to four, a new sound system for the Pavilion, finish the remodel in the Clubhouse (specifically the Pavilion), and a Bocce Ball court.

We were asked again about a "Green Waste" Program in the park. We contacted EDCO, and they are planning to roll out a new community program later this year. We will stay on top of it and share with you when we have more details.

The plan is to install a second round of isolation valves Mid-March. When we have a definite date, the office will communicate to everyone. If you are not able to set aside some drinking water, please reach out to the Board, and we will make sure you are prepared.

And always, if you are alone and need help, please contact the Park Office or any Board Member. If you have a neighbor who is alone, please call them to say hello and check on them. Stay safe and be well.

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
Attention Homebound Seniors



APPLE-CRANBERRY COBBLER

Serves 8 Total Time 30-60minutes

Filling: Topping: 5 Granny Smith apples, 3/4 cup milk

peeled & chopped 1 cup all purpose flour

1 cup cranberries ½ cup sugar

1/4 cup granulated sugar
2 tsp baking soda
1/4 cup brown sugar
2 pinches salt

½ tsp cinnamon ½ tsp nutmeg

2 tsp cornstarch

+Juice of 1 lemon

+Generous pinch salt

8 Tbs butter

Preheat oven to 350. In large bowl, toss together filling ingredients, except butter. In a separate bowl, whisk topping ingredients. Add butter to a 9-inch pie dish and place in oven till melted. Remove from oven and fill with fruit mixture. Pour topping over fruit filling. Bake for one hour or until juices are bubbling and cobbler is golden. Tent with foil if cobbler is getting too brown.
